



If you're interested in a career in Transportation and Logistics, this training could be a good option.

1. Organization providing the training:

Hagerstown Community College

2. Physical location where training occurs:

Training locations vary but all are in Washington County.

3. Description of the training offered:

This training prepares individuals for a career in the transportation and logistics industry. Training tracks include Commercial Truck Driver (CDL A and B), Diesel Technician, and Forklift Operator. CDL A training is a 300-hour course, whereas CDL B is 65 hours. Diesel Technician training is 200 hours in length and prepares individuals to test for various Automotive Service Excellence certifications. Forklift training lasts for 16 hours.

4. Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:

- CDL Class A License
- CDL Class B License

5. Am I eligible?

To be eligible for this training program, applicants must:

- Be 18 years or older.
- Meet program specific requirements including background check and drug screen.
- Be able to pass a Department of Transportation physical, Learner's Permit requirements, and 10-panel non-DOT drug screen.

6. What is the application process?

7. How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment in the transportation and logistics field?

Trainees who complete this program and obtain employment can expect to earn

anywhere from \$30,000 to \$80,000 per year depending upon the training track.

8: How much do I have to pay for this program?

All applicants must pay a \$17 screening fee. Other costs depend upon the training track.
