

Profile of Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) Recipients



Most have recent work experience, but their earnings are low

- ❖ 56% worked in the year before receiving TCA
- Earned a median of \$3,894 in that year
- ❖ 65% worked in the year after leaving TCA
- Earned a median of \$6,712 in that year


They do not receive welfare for long periods of time

59% received assistance for 2 years or less in last 10 years8% received assistance for more than 5 of the last 10 years

Typically, they are African American women with 1 or 2 young children

- ❖ 96% are female.
- ❖ 53% are African American
- 32 years old, on average
- * 68% have 1 to 2 children
- * 47% have a child under 3 years old

Some have disabilities that are expected to last over 1 year



The Upper Shore includes Kent, Queen Anne's, Talbot, Caroline, & Dorchester Counties.

Most data is based on analysis of 349 adult payees who were recipients of TCA benefits in October 2014. Employment and earnings data is based on work-eligible recipients in federal fiscal 2014 and includes only formal employment in Maryland.
