JARC Baltimore center is a nonprofit workforce development organization dedicated to helping unemployed and low-income individuals train for careers in manufacturing and related fields—while providing wraparound support to help participants overcome barriers to employment. We offer in-person technical training in Welding and Computer Numerical Control (CNC).

Welding- Includes basic to intermediate welding skills with safety and proficiency training. It is designed to take up to 14 weeks to complete however, you work at your own progress.

CNC- Teaches operating CNC machinery. The class is designed to take up to 20 weeks to complete however, you work at your own progress.

In additional to technical training, we offer wrap-around Supportive Services to include:

4. Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:

OSHA 10 certification (Construction / General)
Welding- MIG 2F cert (possible Stick 3G and 4G cert)
CNC- Mill Programming, Setup, Operations cert and Lathe Cert
General Forklift certification

5. Am I eligible?

To be eligible, you must:

- -Be authorized to work in the United States
- -Maryland State Residence
- -Over age 18
- -Criminal Background friendly (except sexual offenses)
- -H.S. School Diploma/ GED Required
- -Score above 6th or higher on the CASA assessment

6. What is the application process?

In addition, interested candidates can give us a call at 410-900-1440 where they can speak to JARC's Client Intake Specialist for next steps in the enrollment process; which is attending a virtual or in-person orientation.

Average starting wage for Welding is approximately is \$18-\$20 an hour. Average starting wage for CNC is approximately is \$20-\$23 an hour.
