Information on Identification Requirements for Customers of Non-Depository Financial Services Providers: Maryland Extended Deadline for License Renewals

On June 19, 2020, Maryland Governor Larry Hogan issued Executive Order number 20-06-19-01 (which amends and restates his March 12, 2020 Executive Order) extending the expiration date for certain licenses, permits and registrations that expire or are eligible for renewal during the state of emergency to "the 30th day after the date by which the state of emergency is terminated and the catastrophic health emergency is rescinded". The Maryland Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration (MDOT MVA) issued this statement confirming the continued applicability of the Order.

As such, the Commissioner of Financial Regulation is advising regulated financial service providers that they can continue to accept, as valid identification, driver's licenses and/or identification cards that expired or are eligible for renewal after March 12, 2020.
