# APPLICATIONS DENIED FOR THE PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF ENGINEERING EXAMINATION

Motion (IV) was made by Mr. Mongan, seconded by Mr. Harclerode, and unanimously carried to deny three applications for an insufficient amount of engineering work experience and/or education.

The first applicant applied under Section 14-305(c) of the Engineers' Statute which requires 8-years of experience. The application indicated only 6 years and 4 months of work experience. The Board recommended the applicant reapply after obtaining an additional 1 year and 8 months of engineering work experience. Alternatively, the Board suggested the completion of the educational checklist so that the board can evaluate the degree against the Board's approved standard.

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The second applicant applied under Section 14-305(d) of the Engineers' Statute which requires 12-years of experience. The application indicated only 9 years and 8 months of work experience, after the Board granted an additional year for education in an EAC program. The Board suggests that the applicant reapply after obtaining an additional 1 year and 4 months of engineering work experience. The Board also noted that the applicant will be eligible to apply under 14-305(b) upon the completion of the program that the applicant is currently enrolled in at Penn State.

The third denial applied under Section 14-305(b) of the Engineers' Statute which requires 4-years of experience. The application indicates that 12 years and 1 month of work experience. After review, the Board was only able to credit 2 years and 6 months of experience. The Board gave credit for 1 year and 6 months for one acceptable RPE, plus 1 additional year for an advanced degree. The Board suggests that the applicant reapply after obtaining an additional 1 year and 6 months of engineering work experience.
