ETHICS TRAINING - 10 a.m.

The Board members took the mandatory ethics training which was presented by Katherine Thompson, Assistant General Counsel with the Maryland State Ethics Commission.

CPC COMMITTEE REPORT

Motion (V) was made by Mr. Mongan, seconded by Mr. Harclerode and unanimously carried to approve the CPC Provider Application of Nortec, Online-PDH, Powered Aire, Inc., and Spirotherm, Inc..

REPORT FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mr. Long informed the Board that he received an email from Jerry Carter, Executive Director of NCEES, regarding the concerns that Council Record holders who established their records prior to 2008 have with reestablishing their information in the new system in order to transmit their record. The email stated that NCEES is developing a plan to revise the process and eliminate the need for record holders to resubmit information that has already been supplied to NCEES. Mr. Long stated that Stephanie Goodnow, NCEES Director of Member Services, proposed a solution to the issue regarding council record notations "waived" verses "not required" for FE verifications. Ms. Goodnow proposed that we add "Maryland does not require the FE exam for this candidate" in the comment field of the verification page. The Board agreed that this would solve the problem.

Mr. Long stated that the Design Boards has a surplus of over \$92K as of June 30, 2016. Mr. Long anticipates that the PE Board will maintain a positive balance in the future.

REPORT FROM BOARD COUNSEL

Ms. Trust stated that a working group with representatives from different State boards and agencies will be meeting to discuss the repercussions of the outcome of the NC Dental case. She also informed the Board she will go over the law to insure that all the necessary changes have been made to accommodate computer based testing.

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NEW BUSINESS

Report of the 2016 NCEES Annual Meeting

Chairman Arndt reported that UPLG Motion 12 to amend the Model Law Rules to have a special designation for Structural Engineers failed. He also reported the Technology Task Force Motion 2 regarding the electronic signing and sealing of professional engineering and surveying documents passed but was amended to delete the term "electronic signature" and the SC Motion to increase the amount of Funded Delegates to three passed. ACCA Motion 1 passed to allow up to five hours of flying time to be paid for travel expenses instead of three.

Chairman Arndt noted that Finance Motion 3 passed to decrease the FE exam fees and after the April 2017 examination, all examination charges will

be paid directly to NCEES. This will provide a consistent payment method during the transition period of all PE exams to CBT. Chairman Arndt was concerned that exam fees going directly to NCEES may cause administrative difficulty but Mr. Long stated that it should not be a problem since the change was already made for the Land Surveyor's Board and no problems occurred.

OLD BUSINESS

CPC Requirements

Chairman Arndt asked that a Committee be formed with Mr. Mongan as Chair to review potential changes to the CPC Regulations to eventually include having public meetings to get the input from licensees and engineering societies. Mr. Mongan asked for input from the administrative staff that deals with the audits on issues they are experiencing with the CPC requirements by the October 2016 meeting.

Ms. Trust stated that no new Regulations can be proposed between mid-December and February.

Motion (VI) was made by Ms. Perrin, seconded by Mr. Harclerode and unanimously carried to start the process to propose changes to the CPC Regulations.

Audit Statistics

The audit statistics were addressed in the Report of the Executive Director.

Draft Fine Schedule for PDH Deficiencies

Motion (VII) was made by Ms. Perrin, seconded by Mr. Harclerode and unanimously carried to set the fine for PDH deficiencies at \$1500 effective January 1, 2017. The Board asked that this information be advertised and be updated on all forms and on the website.

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CORRESPONDENCE

Email from John Helwig regarding Fire Protection Engineering and PG County Requirements

The Board received an email from John Helwig dated June 9, 2016. He is concerned that the PG County Code Officials are requiring him to complete an application to become a third party reviewer for Fire Protection System drawings although he has several years of Fire Protections Engineering experience and is licensed in 12 states.

His email was discussed at the June 9, 2016 meeting. The Board felt this is not a jurisdictional matter since the State is the licensing authority. The Board contacted PG County to get a better understanding of the issue and Mr. Long presented the response of PG County to the Board.

Ms. Trust responded to John Helwig's email and provided the Board with a copy of her response. In her response, Ms. Trust informed Mr. Helwig that the Board's jurisdiction extends only to licensees and in some circumstances, to unlicensed individuals, but not to the counties or any other municipalities.

Email from Pam Keilholz regarding Seals Without Signatures

The Board received an email from Pam Keilholtz regarding seals without signatures. Mr. Harclerode agreed to contact her to explain to her what the requirements are regarding sealing documents.

Letter from Benjamin Amoss regarding Denial of PE Exam Application

The Board received a letter appealing the denial of his PE exam application on August 18, 2016. Mr. Amos met with the Board member who reviewed his application prior to the Board meeting to find out what specific examples of work would be satisfactory to the Board in lieu of a PE endorsement. Mr. Amos will have two letters sent to the Board from PE's that he previously worked with so that he can possibly get approved to take the PE exam.

Letter from Muhammad Riaz regarding Denial of PE Reciprocity Application

The Board received a letter appealing the denial of his PE Reciprocity application for an insufficient amount of engineering work experience. His NCEES Council only showed three years and 3 months of engineering work experience when four years of work experience is required. Mr. Riaz had NCEES review his work experience again and NCEES retransmitted his Council Record showing four years and 10 months of engineering work experience so his application was approved.
