Section 24-801 of the Education Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland requires the Governor's P-20 Leadership Council to annually report to you any recommendations from the Council and summarize the Council's activities during the preceding year.

Background

The Governor's P-20 Leadership Council of Maryland ("P-20 Council") was authorized under Chapter 191 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2010 to provide a forum in which the Governor, legislators, and stakeholders from elementary and secondary education, postsecondary education, and the workforce and economic development communities can discuss policy priorities and the alignment of the various elements of our education and workforce systems.

The mission of the Council is to better prepare Maryland students for the jobs of the new economy while enhancing the State's economic competitiveness by developing a workforce with 21st century skills. The Council also ensures that college and career readiness and college completion strategies for Maryland students are implemented.

¹ "P-20" refers to a system of education that encompasses preschool through graduate studies and/or careers, and ensures that students from an early age are learning the necessary skills for a competitive workforce.

In addition to the annual report, the Council is also required to submit a biennial report to the Governor and General Assembly on progress toward implementing college and career readiness and college completion strategies, as prescribed in the College and Career Readiness and College Completion Act of 2013 (CCRCCA, SB740). This biennial report is not due to be submitted until December, 2016.

2015 Accomplishments

New P-20 Council members were appointed by Governor Hogan in September, 2015. A list of the 2015 P-20 Council members and their affiliations is included as Appendix A at the end of this report. A separate list of appointed members by council slot is included in Appendix B at the end of this report.

The Council held its first meeting on Monday, November 16 at the Maryland Department of Transportation. At this meeting, members introduced themselves to one another, were briefed on the legislative background and mission of the Council, were briefed on the goals and recommendations of the previous Council, discussed and approved workgroups to guide the work of the Council, and established meeting dates for 2016. Members were also given copies of the 2014 P-20 annual report, the biennial report "Progress on Implementing College and Career Readiness and College Completion Strategies in Maryland," the 2014 P-20 task force report on teacher preparedness, and the 2014 P-20 task force report on art education.

Proposed Policy Areas for 2016

P-20 Council members formed seven workgroups to carry out the mission of the Council in 2016. These workgroups are still forming as of the publication of this report and have not yet met. Once the workgroups meet, they will develop their mission statement, identify goals and priorities, and reach out to non-Council members for participation.
